Né en 1922 à Ivry-sur-Seine, Pierre Daix a interrompu des études d'histoire pour entrer dans la Résistance à l'automne 1940, puis a été déporté à Mauthausen. Rédacteur en chef des Lettres françaises de 1948 à 1972, il collabore après 1980 au Quotidien de Paris et au Figaro littéraire. Il a publié, entre autres, seize romans

et une autobiographie : Tout mon temps. Historien d'art, il a également écrit de nombreuses monographies de peintres. *L'Oeil, revue d'art* - 2003

Kinetic art not only includes movement but often depends on it to produce an intended effect and therefore fully realize its nature as art. It can take a multiplicity of forms and include a wide range of motion, from motorized and electrically driven movement to motion as the result of wind, light, or other sources of energy. Kinetic art emerged throughout the twentieth century and had its major developments in the 1950s and 1960s. Professionals responsible for conserving contemporary art are in the midst of rethinking the concept of authenticity and solving the dichotomy often felt between original materials and functionality of the work of art. The contrast is especially acute with kinetic art when a compromise between the two often seems impossible. Also to be considered are issues of technological obsolescence and the fact that an artist's chosen technology often carries with it strong sociological and historical information and meanings.

Posthumous Art, Law and the Art Market - Sharon Hecker 2022-04-29

This book takes an interdisciplinary, transnational and cross-cultural approach to reflect on, critically examine and challenge the

surprisingly robust practice of making art after death in an artist's name, through the lenses of scholars from the fields of art history, economics and law, as well as practicing artists. Works of art conceived as multiples, such as sculptures, etchings, prints, photographs and conceptual art, can be—and often are—remade from original models and plans long after the artist has passed. Recent sales have suggested a growing market embrace of posthumous works, contemporaneous with questioning on the part of art history.
